#### Japanese American 442<sup>ND</sup> Regimental Combat Team

The bombing of Pearl Harbor sent the United States into WWII in the Pacific Theater. The all-Japanese American 442<sup>ND</sup> Regimental Combat Team was instituted one year later. Previously, citizens of Japanese ancestry were classified "4C" (enemy alien) which outraged these Americans who were eager to defend their country. The 442<sup>ND</sup> served exclusively in Europe, and their motto was, "Go For Broke!!" One notable member of the 442<sup>ND</sup> was the late Senator Inouye of Hawaii who joined up immediately after its inception, went on to fight in Italy where in April of 1945 he was gravely wounded by a grenade losing an arm, and eventually was awarded the Medal of Honor for bravery.
