#### HISTORIC WORLD WAR I "HELLFIGHTERS"

The US Army 369<sup>TH</sup>, an all African-American infantry regiment, formed out of the New York Guard from the Harlem Armory, served alongside the French Army. The "Hellfighters," as they had become known by the French, saw battle for a total of 191 days, longer than any other unit sent by the US to fight our German enemies. Heroically, the 369<sup>TH</sup> fought in crucial campaigns such as the Battle of Belleau Wood and suffered upwards of 1,500 casualties. The "Hellfighters" were awarded the Croix de Guerre (Legion of Honor) by the French people. The daring deeds of the courageous 369<sup>TH</sup> are chronicled in the book, "Harlem Hellfighters."
