ADMIRAL DAVID G. FARRAGUT, U.S.N

On 16 JUL 1862, David Farragut became the first Rear Admiral of the US Navy. Farragut, of Hispanic heritage, followed the seagoing tradition of his father, Jordi "George" Farragut, who served in the Continental Naval Forces. David Farragut had his first taste of command at the age of twelve during the War of 1812. He would go on to fight in the Battle of Mobile Bay during the Civil War, where he courageously pronounced, "Damn the torpedoes! Four Bells! Captain Drayton, go ahead? Jouett, full speed!" The phrase has since been popularized as, "Damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead!" Farragut eventually became the first US naval officer to achieve the rank of Admiral. Source: farragut.org
