The fleet is comprised of 50 ships of five different types: high-speed logistics (pictured above), ocean surveillance, large landing crafts, coastal tugs, and logistics support vehicles.

The soldiers, or Army mariners as they prefer to be called, that man these vessels fall under the 88K and 88L MOS. The Army mariner's main mission is to keep the ocean logistics routes moving to ensure that goods and equipment make it to even the most remote overseas posts.
