Weird Rules & Regulations

- Straggling**
Article 134-50 makes falling behind on a march or maneuver an offense punishable by confinement for 3 months and forfeiture of two-thirds pay.
- Dueling**
Although it may be legal to engage in [mutual combat](#) in Washington State, don't think about dueling while serving in the armed forces.
- Drinking liquor with a prisoner**
Like the old military saying goes, it's necessary to say this because someone has likely done it before. Article 134-14 makes it explicitly clear that service members can be locked up for imbibing with a prisoner (who will be charged under Article 134-15, Drunk prisoner).
- Jumping from vessel into water**
If you're going to abandon ship, make sure the Captain has given the order first. Under the UCMJ, willfully jumping from a US vessel is a punishable offense. In 2012 a Colonel violated this article in an attempt to escape prosecution onboard a ship. The additional charges he accrued during his escape attempt probably paled in comparison to his original charges of sexual harassment, misusing official funds, falsifying records, bigamy, to name a few.
